

## HAEMONETICS ANNOUNCES COMMITMENT TO COVID-19 RELIEF EFFORTS

Haemonetics is committing to more than \$100,000 in financial assistance to support COVID-19 pandemic response efforts in its home state of Massachusetts as well as across the U.S. and globally.

"At Haemonetics, our teams are dedicated to meaningfully advancing healthcare and supporting the communities where we live and work," said Chris Simon, President and CEO of Haemonetics. "We are committed to doing our part to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic by not only supporting our employees and customers in their important work, but also the professionals on the front lines and people impacted by this global health crisis."

For the Boston and Massachusetts communities, Haemonetics will contribute \$50,000 to the Massachusetts COVID-19 Relief Fund to support front line healthcare professionals, first responders and other essential workers, as well as working families and households disproportionately affected by the impact of the COVID-19 virus. To help support national and global communities, Haemonetics will contribute \$50,000 to the humanitarian organization Direct Relief. The funds will help provide personal protective equipment (PPE) for health workers as well as other essential medicines and equipment to help support COVID-19 patients around the world. In recognition of Haemonetics' global presence, the Company plans to match 100% of all employee donations to Direct Relief's Coronavirus Response Fund up to \$100,000 in additional corporate support.

In addition, Haemonetics is working with the Massachusetts Emergency Management Agency, which is coordinating with the Department of Public Health and Massachusetts Life Sciences Emergency SupplyHub, to donate PPE that will be distributed to front line first responders across the state.

As new areas of science emerge through COVID-19-related research, Haemonetics is also working to provide its technologies to a variety of organizations to help create collection capacity for convalescent plasma and to aid research on COVID-19-associated coagulopathy. Additionally, Haemonetics is supporting its medically qualified employees choosing to volunteer as supplemental staff in healthcare or emergency service settings.
